

Table 1: Homes for All Supports the Senate Proposal for Key Minnesota Housing Finance Agency Programs, (with budget totals added to the Base Budget)

Program	What it does	Budget (FY 14-15 biennium)
Family Homeless Prevention Assistance Fund	Provides direct assistance and services to households at risk of losing housing and transitioning out of homelessness.	\$18.9 million
Challenge Program	Rehabs and constructs affordable housing throughout the state; Senate bill includes \$15 million for workforce housing in communities in Greater Minnesota with low vacancy rates, high job growth, and a strong need for housing.	\$28.9 million
Housing Trust Fund	Provides rental assistance for households that were previously homeless. The Senate bill creates two pilot programs: one for highly-mobile families with school-age children (\$3 million) and one for ex-offenders (\$2 million).	\$26.1 million
Housing Rehabilitation Program	Provides assistance for the rehab of smaller rental properties.	\$5.4 million
Homeownership Education, Counseling and Training	Funds homebuyer/homeowner education counseling, including foreclosure prevention counseling.	\$1.5 million
Capacity Building Grants	Enables regional coordination of housing and homeless programs and leverages federal funding.	\$750,000
Home Ownership Assistance Fund	Provides down payment and closing cost assistance for first-time homebuyers.	\$1.5 million
Additional MHFA Programs	Also included in Senate ask	Approx. \$23 million

Long Term Homeless Supportive Services Fund	Coordinated services to maintain housing and improve self-sufficiency for Minnesotans experiencing long-term homelessness	\$3.5 million
Transitional Housing	Time-limited housing and services for families and individuals who have been homeless	\$1 million
Emergency Services Program	Services and emergency shelter for homeless Minnesotans	\$0.5 million
Homeless Youth Act	Housing and services for youth who are homeless or at-risk	\$2 million (+ \$4 million included in SF1034)
